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Anticipation Guides

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.

Background. An Anticipation Guide is a strategy that is used before

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reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading a selection, students respond to several statements that challenge or support their preconceived ideas about key concepts in the text. Using this strategy stimulates students' interest in a topic and sets a purpose for reading.

Anticipation/Reaction Guide. An Anticipation/Reaction Guide utilizes a twin strategy to increase reading comprehension: stimulate prior knowledge and experiences before reading and then reinforce key concepts after reading. The guide presents students with a series of

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leading questions to be answered in writing before reading.
